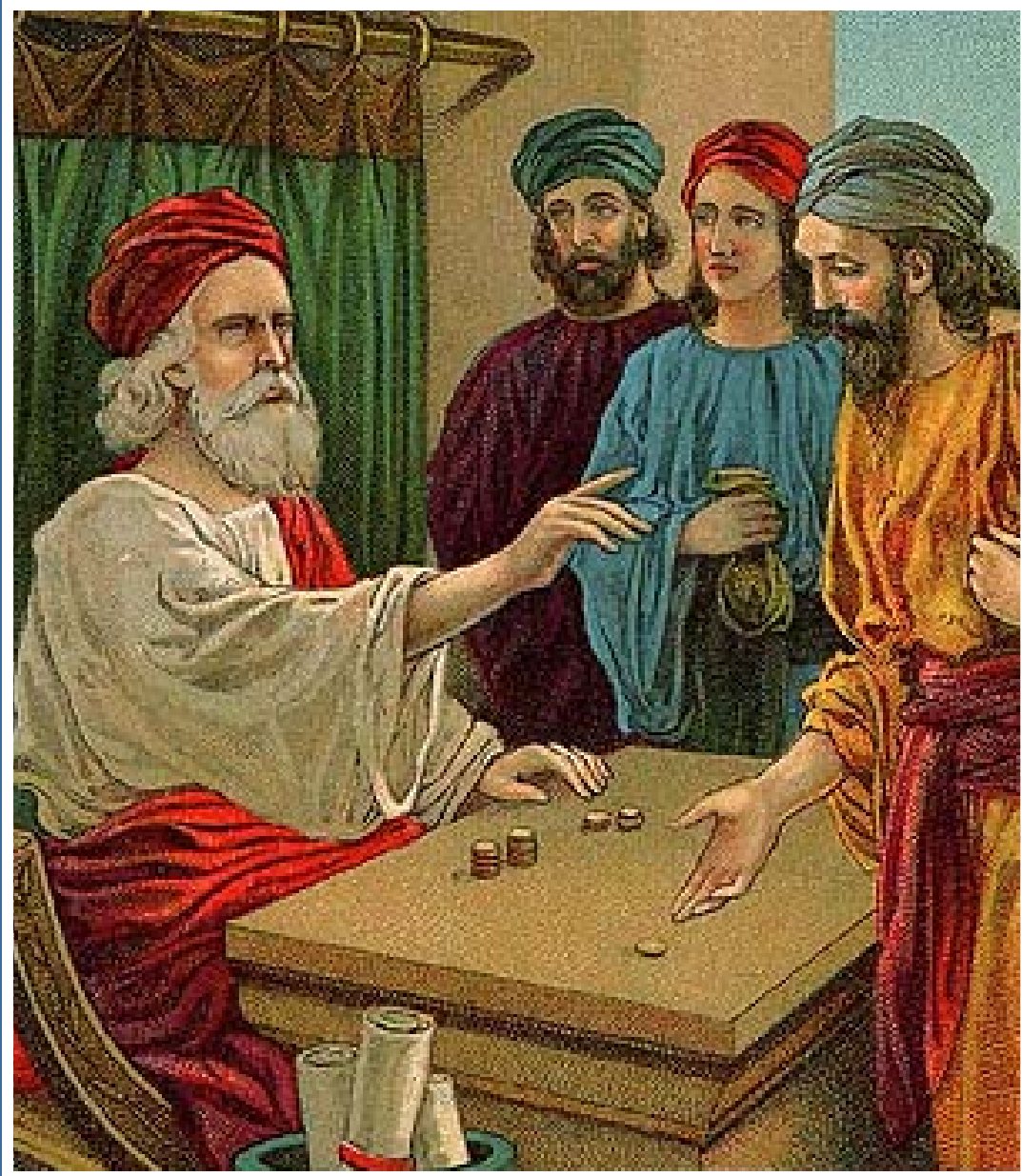

Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Adults requesting information about full initiation and communion with the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) may contact the Faith Formation office at (949) 496-6011.

Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament presumes active sacramental participation on the part of one or both persons. Couples must begin preparation for their Sacrament at least six months prior to their proposed wedding date. Please call the Parish office for more information.

The Parish Capital Campaign of 2000

In the year 2000, the pastor of St. Edward the Confessor Church, Fr. John Lenihan, began a capital campaign to raise \$10 million to accomplish three things: (1) expand the school, (2) purchase additional property adjacent to the parish and (3) build a new parish center. As a result, almost \$8 million was raised and the first two goals were achieved. However, the parish center was not completed. Given the fact that the new parish center plans called for the demolition of the old rectory, a fourplex was purchased in 2009 as a residence for the parish priests.

Of the money raised for the parish capital campaign in 2000, \$660,000 remains in a reserved account. This money was given by parishioners for the purpose of a new parish center and it will only be used for that purpose.

Anticipating the renovation of our church this winter and due to the fact that many of us are still taking care of our commitments to the capital campaign, there are no immediate plans to pursue the construction of a new parish center.

This is a youth ministry sponsored event and Confirmation teens can receive credit for attending.

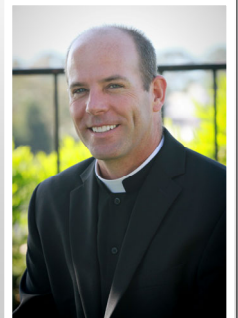

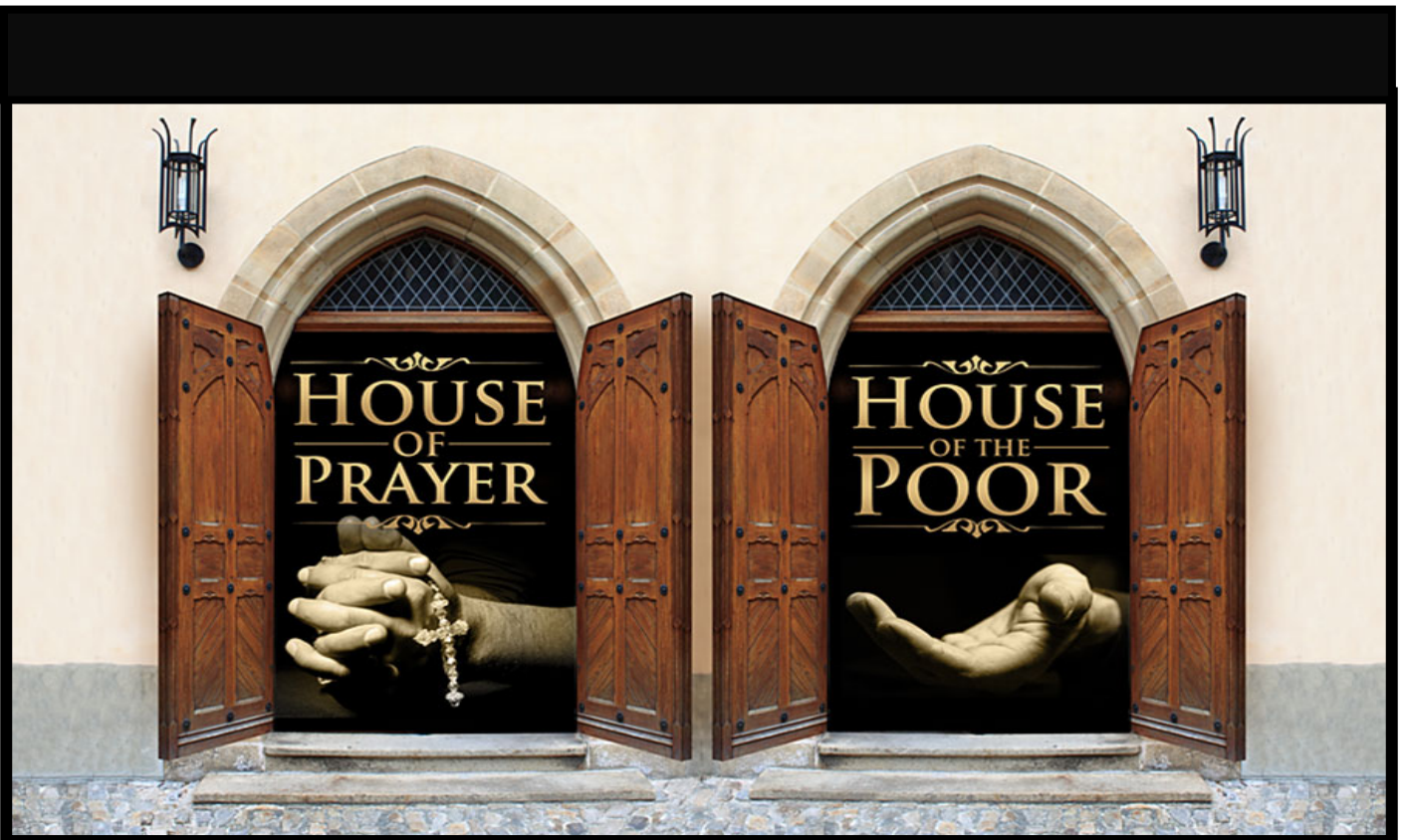

Society of St. Vincent de Paul St. Edward Conference

Who we are:

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is an international, Catholic volunteer organization composed of women and men who strive to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to individuals in need. In this essential way, the Society differs from charitable associations or agencies whose principal objective is not the spiritual advancement of their members but the doing of good for someone else. Vincentians come from every ethnic and cultural background, age group, and economic level but are united by their spirit of poverty, humility and sharing, which is nourished by prayer and reflection, mutually supportive gatherings.

What we do:

Guided by the credo of *"No Act of Charity is Foreign to the Society"*..., we offer tangible assistance to those in need on a person-to-person basis. It is our personalized involvement that makes the work of the Society unique. This aid may take the form of intervention, consultation, or often through direct dollar or in-kind service. An essential precept of our work is to provide help while conscientiously maintaining the confidentiality and dignity of those we serve. Our St. Edward Conference:

- † Provides bus passes, funds to help with rent, medical expenses, car repair, utilities and other items for the needy and underemployed in our church area.
- † Makes home visits to evaluate our clients' physical and spiritual needs.
- † Supplies food for our Christian Service office to distribute.
- † Collects & distributes toys to needy children during Christmas.
- † Sends 20-25 children to SVdP camps during the summer.
- † Distributes turkeys and food to the needy for Thanksgiving.
- † Provides motel stays and other accommodations for the homeless.
- † Helps find jobs for the disadvantaged.
- † Connects the disadvantaged to helpful resources.
- † Provides legal assistance thru our contacts.
- † Act as advocates for people when requested.
- † Supports other non-profit organization with funds and services.
- † Supplies gift cards to Christian Service Office.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- 1) Join us! We meet the third Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the church meeting room. We also attend the 5:30 p.m. Mass together on the first Wednesday of the month.
- 2) Volunteer: We need volunteers who can meet with individuals who request assistance. Typically we work in teams of two to meet and assess a person's needs and situation. Most requests are during weekdays.
- 3) Contribute: We are supported by funds donated through the church, grants, and personal donations.
- 4) Pray for the poor and those who serve them.

Ministry Spotlight

Society of St. Vincent de Paul is Almost 200 Years Old

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded in Paris, France in 1833 by a 20-year old student, Frederic Ozanam. Challenged by the poverty he saw on the streets, and by his contemporaries who believed the Church no longer demonstrated an active faith in works of charity, Frederic organized the first "Conference of Charity" to help the poor of all religions created by the industrial revolution, as well as create an avenue that assisted people to express their faith and grow spiritually through acts of charity. Frederic named his conferences after the great French Saint, Vincent de Paul, who was known for his heroic goodness to the poor.



Today, the Society is a international Catholic volunteer organization with more than 800,000 members in 140 countries, and a mission to "seek and find the forgotten, the suffering or the deprived."

Some 12 million persons are helped annually by Vincentians in the United States. Vincentians have served the suffering in Southern California for over 100 years.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a 501(c3) non-profit organization.

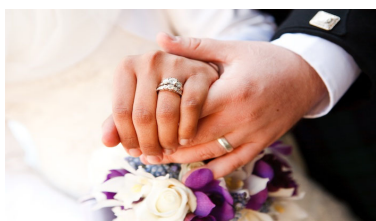
