Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament presumes active sacramental participation on the part of one or both persons. Couples must begin preparation for their Sacrament at least six months prior to their proposed wedding date. Please call the Parish office for more information.

On the first and third Monday of each month for 24 hours beginning after 8:15 a.m. Mass. Adoration in San Felipe the 1st Friday of every month 8 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

In 2007, I was living in Morelia, Mexico, for a month doing my best to improve my Spanish. There seemed to be a Catholic Church on every corner. On several evenings, I heard the sound of church bells ringing unceasingly followed by fireworks and music. I asked my Spanish instructor what was being celebrated and why only some of the churches were celebrating and not all of them. She laughed and told me that they were celebrating their *fiestas patronales*, the feast of their patron saint. Sometimes the celebration lasts one day, sometimes it lasts nine days (called a *novenario*). The streets are decorated and proud parishioners carry a statue of their patron saint through their neighborhood, singing and praying.

This Tuesday, October 13th, we celebrate the feast day of our patron saint, Edward the Confessor. (Many of our Hispanic parishioners reasonably assume that the feast of St. Edward is in May because that's when we have our parish fiesta). We haven't traditionally done much to celebrate our patron saint day, so let's change that.

We won't have rides or fireworks Tuesday, but there will be opportunities for us to come together to praise God and thank St. Edward for interceding for us as a parish family.

En el 2007, durante un mes viví en Morelia, Michoacán México haciendo mi mejor esfuerzo para mejorar mi español. Parecía que había una iglesia católica en cada esquina. Durante varias noches, oí el sonido de campanas de la iglesia sin cesar seguido de fuegos artificiales y música. Le pregunté a mi instructora de español que era lo que se celebra y por qué sólo en algunas de las iglesias sonaban campanadas y no en todas. Ella se sonrió y me dijo que estaban celebrando sus *fiestas patronales*, la fiesta de su santo patrón. A veces, la celebración dura un día, a veces dura nueve días (*un novenario*). Las calles se decoran y los feligreses orgullosos llevan en procesión una estatua de su santo patrón por las calles de barrio, cantando y orando.

Este martes 13, de octubre se celebra la festividad de nuestro patrono, San Eduardo el Confesor. (Muchos de nuestros feligreses hispanos suponer razonablemente que la fiesta de San Eduardo es en el mes de mayo porque es cuando tenemos nuestra fiesta parroquial). Como tradición nosotros no hemos hecho mucho para celebrar nuestro día del santo patrón, así que vamos a cambiar esto.

No tendremos ninguna feria, ni fuegos artificiales el martes, pero si habrá oportunidad para que nos unamos a alabar a Dios y agradecerle a San Eduardo por interceder por nosotros como familia parroquial.

Facilities Update

Creating a welcoming place for people with disabilities

Maintaining a large parish facility that includes a church, hall, school, field, off-site rectory for the priests, and parish chapel is quite an expensive and time-consuming task. With the renovation of the church, we have been making substantial improvements to better accommodate people with physical disabilities. You may be surprised to know that 1 in 4 people have a physical disability. Here is a summary of what we have been doing.

- ◆ Complete remodel of the public restrooms. We changed the floor plan and adjusted the internal walls and partitions to provide adequate space for wheelchairs. Fixtures were replaced and bars added to ensure compliance with current code requirements. At the same time, we added water efficient toilets and urinals, auto flushers and faucets, new LED light fixtures, and efficient hand dryers to be as "green" as possible.
- ◆ The arched walkway was redone over the summer to correct slope issues and facilitate easy travel for our guests in wheelchairs. Given the current drought and cost to maintain the plants in the walkway, we opted to extend the width thereby reducing water usage and eliminating the need for seasonal plants and maintenance.
- ◆ Truncated domes were added in front of the church and school to provide a tactile warning to our sight impaired guests that they were entering traffic.
- ◆ Two van-accessible parking spaces were added on each side of the covered walkway.
- ◆ A wheelchair accessible ramp was added in the church to provide better access to the sanctuary for liturgical ministers such as lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, and clergy.
- ◆ Some adjustments will be made to the pews downstairs to add and better integrate additional wheelchair seating.

Thank you for your support and patience as we work to make our church facilities more accessible and welcoming to peoples with physical disabilities.

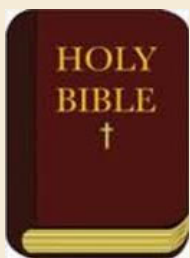

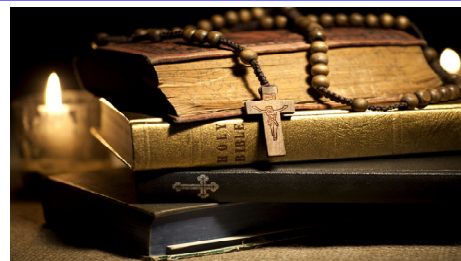

On October 13, 1917, Mary made her final appearance at Fatima as our Lady of Mt. Carmel. Lucia added, "As Pope Pius XII said, it is the sign of our consecration to her Immaculate Heart. " The Brown Scapular is an instrument of faith, hope and love. It gives those beneath it the "feeling" of being beneath our Lady's Mantle...next to her heart. Despite our weaknesses, wearing the Brown Scapular makes us powerful instruments in Mary's hands for the conversion of sinners & unbelievers.

The Brown Scapular was first given by Mary to St. Simon Stock, superior of the Carmelite Order on July 16, 1251. Mary told him:
"Receive the Brown Scapular. It is a pledge of salvation, a safeguard in danger."

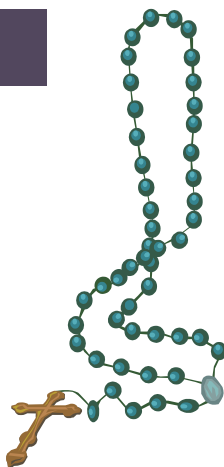

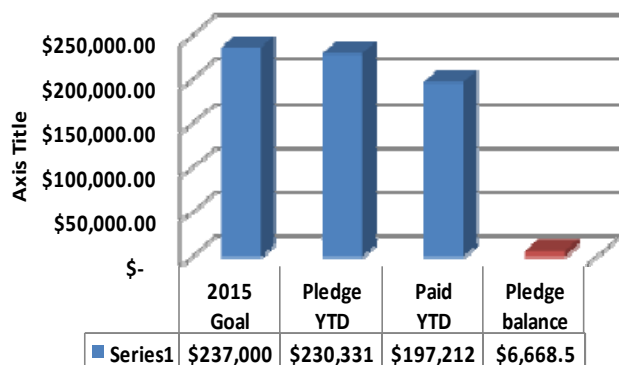
