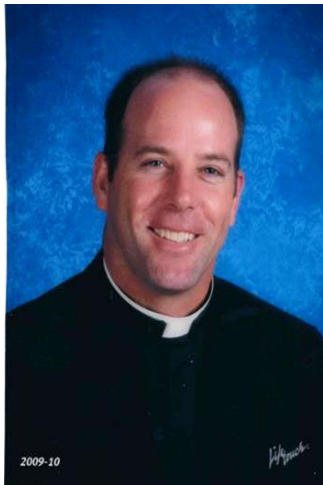
Sacrament of Matrimony

One Spirit, Different Tongues

On this feast of Pentecost we get a glimpse into the ethnically and culturally diverse city of Jerusalem. Gathered together where “Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, and inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia.... (Acts 2:9). In the midst of that diversity the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and gave them the gift of tongues calling them and enabling them to preach the Gospel in the native language of each person.

The church is even more diverse today than it was on the day of Pentecost. Over the course of 2,000 years of Christianity many have responded to Jesus’ call: “Go out to all the world and tell the good news” (Mk 16:15). The Holy Spirit did not limit the apostles to speaking the predominate languages of Jerusalem: Hebrew, Latin and Greek. Instead, the one Spirit empowered the apostles to speak in a way that “each one heard them speaking in his own language.” (Acts 2:8).

In his Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium*, Pope Francis emphasizes the importance of providing the faithful the opportunity to pray in their native language: “Just as all of us like to be spoken to in our mother tongue, so too in the faith we like to be spoken to in our “mother culture,” our native language (cf. 2 Macc 7:21, 27), and our heart is better disposed to listen. This language is a kind of music which inspires encouragement, strength and enthusiasm.” (#139)

According to a 2013 survey by CARA, about three in ten U.S. parishes (29 percent) indicate that they celebrate at least one Mass a month in a language other than English. This is equivalent to more than 5,000 parishes. In the Diocese of Orange, the majority of our 62 parishes celebrate Mass in two languages and several celebrate Mass in three languages every weekend. When Catholics come together for major Diocesan celebrations such as the Rite of Ordination, the Chrism Mass, and the Rite of Election, Mass is always celebrated in three languages: English, Spanish and either Vietnamese or Korean.

Diversity or Division

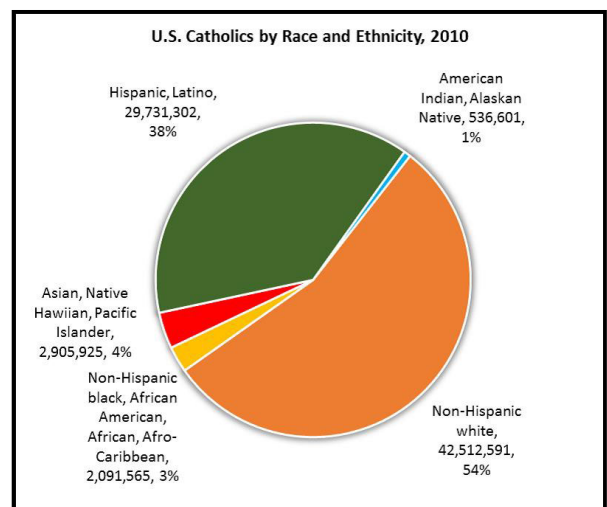
Through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit Jesus Christ has made of us “[one] chosen race, a holy nation... a people of his own” (1 Pet 2:9). Some Christians share the temporary bonds of a common ethnicity, native language and country. However, Christians are first and foremost citizens of heaven (Phil 3:20) and united by Christian faith and the eternal bond of Christian love.

The one Spirit called and empowered the apostles to preach the Good News in different tongues in order to unite all people to God the Father and to one another. Allowing the Holy Spirit into our heart and into our faith community is the key to being a richly diverse church without becoming a divided church. The Holy Spirit always unites us.

At Pentecost, “...there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were” (Acts 2:2). May we open our doors and invite the Holy Spirit to fill our heart and homes.

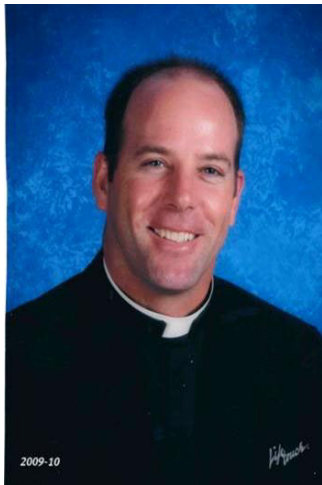

Un mismo Espíritu, Diferentes Lenguas

En esta fiesta de Pentecostés damos un vistazo a la diversidad étnica y cultural de la ciudad de Jerusalén. Reunidos en "Partos, medos y elamitas, habitantes de Mesopotamia, Judea, Capadocia.... (Hechos 2:9). En medio de esa diversidad el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los apóstoles y les dio el don de lenguas, y esto les permitió predicar el Evangelio en el idioma nativo de cada persona.

La iglesia es mucho más amplia de lo que fue en el día de Pentecostés. En el curso de 2000 años de cristianismo muchos han respondido a la llamada de Jesús: "Vayan por todo el mundo y prediquen la buena noticia" (Marcos 16:15). El Espíritu Santo no limitó a los apóstoles a que solo hablaran los idiomas nativos como: hebreo, latín y griego. De lo contrario el Espíritu les dio poder de palabra en el idioma nativo de cada persona "cada uno de nosotros les oímos en nuestra propia lengua nativa." (Hechos 2:8).

En su Exhortación Apostólica *Evangelii Gaudium*, el Papa Francisco subraya la importancia de proporcionarle a la oportunidad y a los fieles la oportunidad de la oración en su idioma natal: "Al igual que todos nosotros nos gusta que nos hablen en nuestra lengua nativa, al igual en la fe que nos gusta que nos hablen en nuestro idioma nativo (cf. II de Macabeos 7:21, 27), nuestro corazón estará más dispuesto a escuchar. Escuchar nuestra propia lengua es como un tipo de música que inspira aliento, fuerza y entusiasmo." (#139)

De acuerdo a un estudio que se hizo en el 2013 por CARA, aproximadamente tres de cada diez parroquias estadounidenses (29%) indicaron que ellos celebran al menos una Misa al mes en un idioma distinto del inglés. Esto es equivalente a más de 5000 parroquias. En la diócesis de Orange, la mayoría de nuestras 62 parroquias celebran misa en dos idiomas y varias celebran misa en tres idiomas cada fin de semana. Cuando los católicos se reúnen para grandes celebraciones diocesanas, como el Rito de la Ordenación, la Misa Crismal, y el Rito de la Elección, la Misa siempre se celebra en tres idiomas: inglés, español y vietnamita o coreano.

Diversidad o división

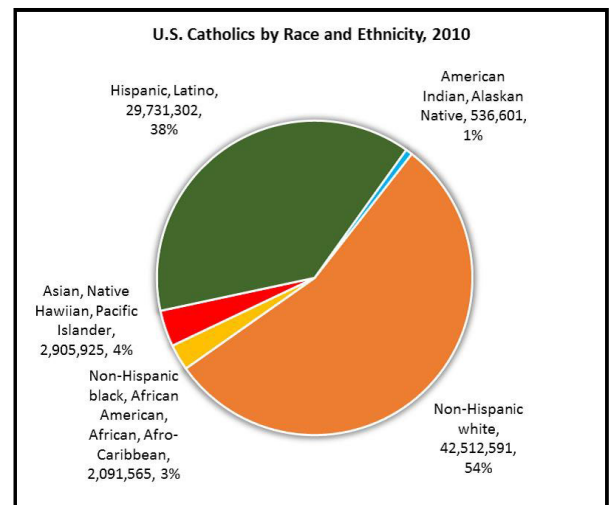
A través de la efusión del Espíritu Santo Cristo ha hecho de nosotros "(un)" linaje, una nación santa, el pueblo de Dios" (I Pedro 2:9). Algunos cristianos comparten los vínculos temporales de un común origen étnico, idioma nativo y el país. Sin embargo, los Cristianos son en primer lugar los ciudadanos del cielo (Fil 3:20) y unidos por la misma fe y el vínculo eterno del amor cristiano.

El Espíritu que llamo y envió a los apóstoles a predicar la Buena Nueva en diferentes lenguas con el fin de unir a todas las personas a Dios Padre y unirlos unos a otros. Permitiendo que el Espíritu Santo entre a nuestro corazón y a nuestra comunidad de fe es la clave para hacer de esta iglesia rica y diversa sin convertirla en una iglesia desunida. El Espíritu Santo siempre nos une.

Durante el día de Pentecostés, "... De repente vino del cielo un ruido como el de una ráfaga de viento impetuoso que llenó toda la casa donde estaban sentados" (Hechos 2:2). Que podamos abrir nuestras puertas e invitar al Espíritu Santo para llenar nuestros corazones y nuestros hogares.

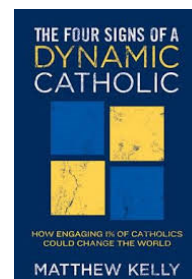

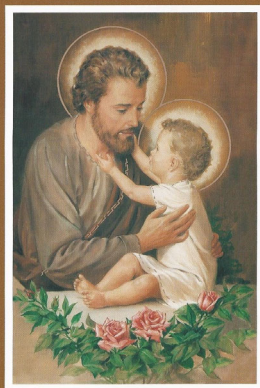
