Arzobispo Gómez: Habla del Proyecto de ley que obligaría a Sacerdotes a violar el secreto de confesión en Estados Unidos.



El Arzobispo de Los Ángeles, Mons. José Gómez, recordó que “la confesión es sagrada para todo sacerdote y para todo católico”, ante el proyecto de ley que exigiría a los confesores violar el secreto del sacramento para reportar un abuso sexual si es que la información se recibe en esa instancia.

En una columna titulada “La confesión es sagrada”, el Prelado se refirió al proyecto de ley 360 del Senado del estado de California, que ordenaría que los sacerdotes divulguen las informaciones sobre abuso sexual de menores que escuchen en confesión.

Mons. Gómez explicó que este proyecto es **“una amenaza mortal para la libertad religiosa de todos los católicos”**. “Lo que es más alarmante es que este proyecto de ley se está promoviendo sin tener ninguna evidencia de que protegerá a los niños”, agregó.

El arzobispo recordó que los sacerdotes católicos ya son “reportadores obligatorios” en California. “Eso significa que estamos obligados por ley a reportar los casos de abuso sexual que sospechemos, excepto si nos enteramos de ello en el confesionario”, resaltó.

El proyecto de ley 360 afirma que “se ha abusado en gran escala del secreto sacramental del clero con respecto al penitente, lo cual ha resultado en el abuso no denunciado y sistemático de miles de niños pertenecientes a múltiples credos y religiones”.

Mons. Gómez escribió además que “el proyecto del ley 360 del Estado pretende resolver una crisis que no existe. El hecho es que el abuso sexual infantil no es un pecado que la gente confiese a los sacerdotes en el confesionario. Los que atienden psicológicamente a tales depredadores nos dicen que lamentablemente muchos de ellos tienden a mantener el secreto, son manipuladores y no pueden comprender el grave daño de sus acciones”.

Pastoral Center and Narthex Project Still Moving Forward

The Project Committee (consisting of parishioners, Fr. Philip, architects, and parish staff) and chaired by long-term parishioner, John Markel, continues with work on the new pastoral center and narthex. Over the past few months, this committee has worked with interested stakeholders to provide input in the form of “design-development meetings”, from things such as kitchen layout and landscaping to lighting and security enhancements.

As we move forward, architectural designs will be formulated and shared with everyone at a parish community meeting to be held in September 2019. Please watch for announcements in the bulletin, the Beacon, and on the parish website.

Come, Holy Spirit

Pentecost is often called the birthday of the Church. This is because the coming of the Holy Spirit transformed the Apostles from being a group of *followers* of Christ into being the *Mystical Body* of Christ, the living presence of Christ in the world. Three symbols help us understand the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

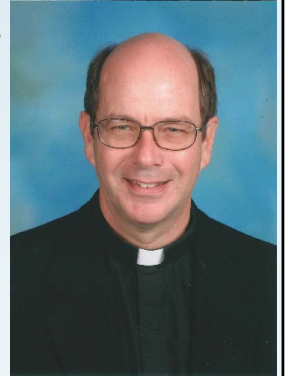
The Scriptural account of the first Pentecost (in Acts 2:1-11) tells us that the coming of the Holy Spirit was signaled by the sound of a strong driving wind. Wind is invisible, like the Holy Spirit; we do not see the wind, but we see and feel its effects. The same is true of the Holy Spirit. Also, we could say that the wind was like the breath of God himself. (In fact, the Latin word for breath is *spiritus*.)

The Acts of the Apostles tell us that tongues of fire appeared and came to rest on each of the Apostles. Fire shows us the warmth of love and the light of faith; these are two important aspects of the life and work of the Holy Spirit in us.

Another symbol of the Holy Spirit is found in the Gospel accounts of the Baptism of Christ. They tell us that the Holy Spirit appeared over Christ in the form of a dove. The dove is a sign of peace; one of the clearest signs that we are being guided by the Holy Spirit is that we have true inner peace.

Today we rejoice in the many ways that the invisible, yet infinitely powerful, Spirit of God works in us and around us. May all we do be guided by the Holy Spirit, the life-breath of God himself.

Ven, Espíritu Santo

Pentecostés es llamado a menudo el cumpleaños de la Iglesia. Esto se debe a que la venida del Espíritu Santo transformó a los apóstoles de ser un grupo de seguidores de Cristo en un cuerpo místico de Cristo, la presencia viva de Cristo en el mundo. Tres símbolos nos ayudan a entender la obra del Espíritu Santo en nuestras vidas.

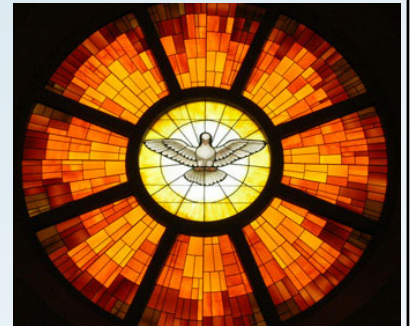
El relato bíblico del primer Pentecostés (en Hechos 2:1-11) nos dice que la venida del Espíritu Santo se oyó un gran ruido que venía del cielo, como cuando sopla un viento fuerte. El viento es invisible, como el Espíritu Santo; No vemos el viento, pero vemos y sentimos sus efectos. Lo mismo se aplica al Espíritu Santo. Además, podríamos decir que el viento era como el aliento de Dios mismo. (De hecho, la palabra en latín para aliento es *spiritus*.)

Los Hechos de los Apóstoles nos dicen que las lenguas de fuego aparecieron y se postraron sobre cada uno de los Apóstoles. El fuego simboliza el calor del amor y la luz de la fe; Estos son dos aspectos importantes de la vida y obra del Espíritu Santo en nosotros.

Otro símbolo del Espíritu Santo se encuentra en los relatos del Evangelio del Bautismo de Cristo. Nos dice que el Espíritu Santo apareció sobre Jesucristo en forma de paloma. La paloma simboliza la paz; Una de las señales más claras de que estamos siendo guiados por el Espíritu Santo es que tenemos una verdadera paz interior.

Hoy nos regocijamos en las muchas formas en que el invisible, eh infinitamente poderoso, Espíritu de Dios trabaja en nosotros y alrededor de nosotros. Que todo lo que hagamos sea guiado por el Espíritu Santo, el aliento de vida de Dios mismo.

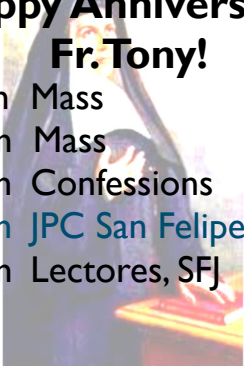

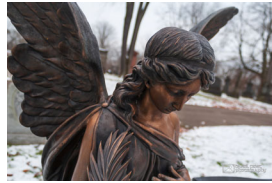

Missionary Bishop Visit

Next weekend, we welcome Bishop Chad Zielinski from the mission Diocese of Fairbanks in Alaska.



Bishop Zielinski faces the challenging task of shepherding the largest geographic diocese in the United States with only seventeen priests, compounded by Alaska's vast distances and the isolation of the Catholic communities from access to roads.

Amongst the poorest dioceses in the nation, only eight of its 46 parishes and missions are capable of financial self-support. 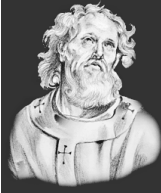
