Independence Day

This Tuesday our country celebrates the anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The last sentence of that document, right before the signatures of our Founding Fathers, contains an important phrase: "with firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence."

"With firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence": Someone could say, "That doesn't sound like a declaration of independence; it sounds like a declaration of dependence." And they would be right. Our Founding Fathers declared their *independence* from an oppressive foreign power, but they also declared their *dependence* on God.

This teaches us an important principle that is almost never stated: freedom and independence are not the same thing. Freedom requires dependence on the only one who can make us free. This is true politically and socially; it is also true (and especially important) morally. The only way we can be free from sin (the most oppressive and tyrannical force that exists) is to be completely dependent on the one who frees us from sin; that is, of course, Our Lord.

May the Lord bless our nation on this weekend, and may we always show our "firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence."

Día de la Independencia

Este martes nuestro país celebra el aniversario de la Declaración de Independencia. El ultimo párrafo de ese documento, justo antes de las firmas de nuestros Padres Fundadores, contiene una frase importante que dice: "con firme confianza en la protección de la Divina Providencia".

"Con firme confianza en la protección de la Divina Providencia": Alguien podría decir: "Eso no suena como una declaración de independencia; eso suena como una declaración de dependencia". Y ellos estarían en lo correcto. Nuestros Padres Fundadores declararon su independencia de un poder extranjero opresor, pero también declararon su dependencia de Dios.

Esto nos enseña un principio importante que casi nunca se menciona: la libertad y la independencia no son lo mismo. La libertad exige la dependencia del único nos puede hacer libres. Esto es cierto política y socialmente; también es cierto (y especialmente importante) moralmente. La única forma en que podemos estar libres del pecado (que es la fuerza más opresiva y tiránica que existe) es depender completamente de quien nos liberó del pecado; ese fue, por supuesto, Nuestro Señor.

Que el Señor bendiga a nuestra nación en este fin de semana y que siempre mostremos nuestra "firme confianza en la protección de la Divina Providencia".
