Celebration of Christian Funerals

At the time of death, a family member should contact the Parish office to arrange the date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Adults requesting information about full initiation and communion with the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) may contact the Faith Formation office at (949) 496-6011.

Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament presumes active sacramental participation on the part of one or both persons. Couples must begin preparation for their Sacrament at least six months prior to their proposed wedding date. Please call the Parish office for more information.

On the first and third Monday of each month for 24 hours beginning after 8:15 a.m. Mass. Adoration in San Felipe the 1st Friday of every month 8 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

Three Kings and Three Refugees

Today's Gospel reveals a beautiful encounter between the three magi and the infant Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Three foreigners left their home country on a long pilgrimage to find and adore the newborn King. I can imagine the calm and silent night as the magi walk in procession to present the best they have to offer: gold, frankincense, & myrrh.

However, the calm and silent night would be quickly shattered by a disturbing message from an angel who appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him" (Mth 2:13). And so, the three kings return home and the Holy Family quickly becomes the Three Refugees. No one would make room for the Holy Family when Mary was pregnant in Bethlehem and now that the Baby Jesus is born, they are forced to flee to a foreign country as Jesus' life is in serious jeopardy.

The number of refugees fleeing Africa, Asia, and the Middle East is the largest-scale exodus since World War II. In his visit to the U.S., Pope Francis told the House of Representatives and the Senate, that the solution to the refugee crisis is for other countries to follow the Golden Rule: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you. On this continent, too, thousands of persons are led to travel north in search of a better life for themselves and for their loved ones, in search of greater opportunities. Is this not what we want for our own children?"

Later, the Pope again addressed the plight of refugees saying, "We must not be taken aback by their numbers, but rather view them as persons, seeing their faces and listening to their stories, trying to respond as best we can to their situation. We need to avoid a common temptation nowadays: to discard whatever proves troublesome. Instead, when the stranger in our midst appeals to us, we must not repeat the sins and the errors of the past, we must resolve now to live as nobly and as justly as possible, as we educate new generations not to turn their back on our neighbors and everything around us."

Let us be merciful as our heavenly Father is merciful by welcoming the stranger, the refugee and the immigrant.

Tres Reyes y Tres Refugiados

El evangelio de hoy revela un hermoso encuentro entre los tres Reyes Magos y el niño Jesús, María y José. Tres extranjeros habían dejado su país de origen en un largo peregrinaje para encontrar y adorar al Rey recién nacido. Me puedo imaginar la calma y el silencio de la noche mientras los reyes caminaban en procesión para presentar lo mejor que tienen para ofrecer: oro, incienso, y mirra.

Sin embargo, la noche calma y silenciosa se rompió rápidamente por un mensaje inquietante de un ángel que se le apareció a José en un sueño y le dijo: "Levántate, toma al niño y a su madre, huye a Egipto, y quédate allí hasta que yo te diga. Herodes va a buscar al niño para matarlo" (Mateo 2:13). Y así, los tres reyes volvieron a casa y la Sagrada Familia rápidamente se convirtió en tres refugiados. Nadie le dio posada a la Sagrada Familia cuando María estaba embarazada en Belén. Y como el Niño Jesús nació, se vieron obligados a huir a un país extranjero, pues la vida de Jesús se encontraba en grave peligro.

El número de refugiados que huyen de África, Asia y el Medio Oriente es el éxodo de mayor escala desde la Segunda Guerra Mundial. En su visita a los EE.UU., El Papa Francisco dijo a la Cámara de Representantes y el Senado, que la solución a la crisis de refugiados de otros países era seguir la regla de oro: "Haz a los demás como te gustaría que te hicieran a ti." En este continente, también, miles de personas viajan al norte en búsqueda de una vida mejor para ellos y para sus seres queridos, en búsqueda de oportunidades mayores. ¿No es esto lo que queremos para nuestros hijos?

Más tarde, el Papa se dirigió de nuevo a la situación de los refugiados diciendo: "No debemos ser sorprendidos por sus números, sino verlos como personas, ver sus rostros y escuchar sus historias, tratando de responder lo mejor que podemos a sus situaciones. Tenemos que evitar la tentación común de hoy en día: de descartar lo que demuestra ser problemático. En cambio, cuando el desconocido este entre nosotros, no debemos repetir los pecados y los errores del pasado, debemos resolver ahora vivir los más noblemente y justamente posible, y así educamos a las nuevas generaciones a no dar la espalda a nuestros vecinos y a todos los que nos rodean".

Seamos misericordiosos como nuestro Padre celestial es misericordioso dándole bienvenida al extranjero, los refugiados y los inmigrantes.

An Opportunity to Support Christian Refugees

Christians in the Middle East face persecution and extinction simply because they are Christian. Many have been executed and several hundred thousand have been forced from their villages in Iraq and Syria. The Knights of Columbus have decided to spread awareness of their dire situation and show our solidarity and support by purchasing olive wood crosses made in Bethlehem and making them available to parishioners.

Syrian Refugee Crisis

Syrian refugees continue to flee the devastating civil war that has left their country in ruins for more than four years. Many Syrian children have grown up knowing only war. Half of the estimated 3.9 million Syrian refugees are children, and a majority of them have been out of school for most of their young lives. The Syrian refugee population represents the largest forced migration since World War II. Neighboring countries bear a heavy burden as their economies, societies and infrastructure struggle to absorb millions of refugees. Lebanon alone has more than 1.1 million refugees, the highest number per capita in the world.

Catholic Relief Services Response (CRS)

CRS is responding throughout the region—primarily in Jordan, Lebanon, Egypt, Turkey and Iraq—to support Syrians and local communities affected by the influx of refugees. Our priorities for the 600,000 war-affected Syrians we serve include:

- Shelter and rent assistance

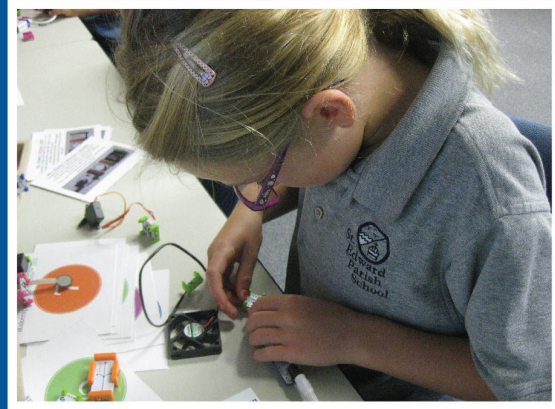

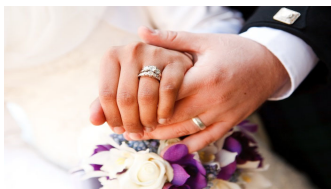
