At the time of death, a family member should contact the Parish office to arrange the date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Adults requesting information about full initiation and communion with the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) may contact the Faith Formation office at (949) 496-6011.

Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament presumes active sacramental participation on the part of one or both persons. Couples must begin preparation for their Sacrament at least six months prior to their proposed wedding date. Please visit our website for information and forms or call the Parish office.

Eucharistic Adoration

On the first and third Monday of the month for 24 hours beginning after 8:15 a.m. Mass. Adoration at San Felipe de Jesus Chapel on the first Friday of every month 8 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

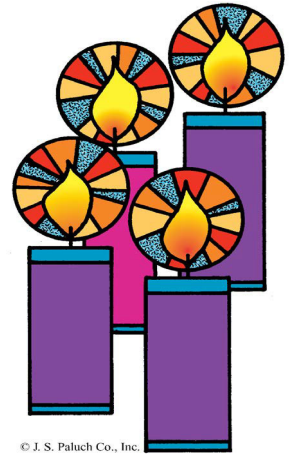

Also, the initial renderings of the pastoral center are now available to view on our parish website (stedward.com). The plans will continue to develop based on the feedback of parishioners, our neighbors, and the City of Dana Point. More detailed renderings will be presented in January and the parish kick-off for the capital campaign will begin the weekend of February 10/11th. DAILY ADVENT PEACE PRACTICES

DEC 3 - Today, find an opportunity to embrace one small act of poverty. Make a donation to a charity, provide a meal for someone in need, donate items to a thrift store. And as you carry this out, recall to mind your true treasure which is only found with God.

DEC 4 - Today, reach out to someone you know who suffers in this way. Take a moment and be their Simon of Cyrene. Help them in some small way to carry this cross.

DEC 5 - Today, help someone in a physical way, as much as our bodily strength allows. For some of us, this will mean caring for an infant, attending to the elderly or simply doing the physical labors our job requires. But for others to whom strength is limited, we can still give by hugging someone, making a cup of tea for another, or simply giving a beautiful smile to a stranger.

DEC 6 - Today, take a moment to search your own soul and gently acknowledge where your spiritual life is not all it could and should be. Think about and write down how you can become more fully the person God is asking you to be.

DEC 7 - Today, place yourself in the heart of Jesus and realize that these shortcomings of ours are completely forgiven in the love of our God. Leave these burdens with our God instead of constantly carrying them in our souls.

DEC 8 - Take a moment to be aware of all the places that our society still views certain humans as things to be used, rather than people to be loved, respected and protected. Pray for them, pray for our world to change, but above all, pray that we may be the voice of God, crying out for change.

DEC 9 - Pray for a person who has wronged you in some way. Without negating the wrong they have done, pray that God will heal the heart and this person would come to know more fully the great love of Christ. No one is too far gone for the mercy of Jesus.

DEC 10 - Walk the path of Christ by setting a wrong, right. Heal a broken relationship, give without expecting in return, and give love to those who seem they cannot love. And in this small act of righteousness, recall that we bring the kingdom of heaven to earth.

DEC 11 - Listen attentively to the language around you. Reject those words which harm and degrade others or yourself. Make an effort to speak positivity, love and joy into the hearts of those around you.

DEC 12 - Today, upon awakening, say a prayer of thanks. Recognize that you have been given a whole new day to experience life, to grow, eat, laugh, explore, create and discover what it feels like to be fully human, fully alive. Appreciate this amazing gift.

DEC 13 - Living in peace is both an outward and inward experience. Seek to understand that peace is living in a way which embraces respect and tolerance. Live outwardly today in peace by loving each other despite our religious, cultural or political differences. Inwardly, cultivate peace by overcoming and managing your fears and anger. Find some quiet time today to re-charge your soul.

DEC 14 - Comparing and competing with other people is one of the fastest ways to lose your peace and joy. There is a freedom in learning to be happy with who you are and what you have without being jealous of someone else's skills, achievements or possessions. Today think about how blessed you really are.

DEC 15 - Today, share your practice of peacemaking with two other people. As more of us participate in this sharing, our practice will expand into a critical mass, reaching many instead of a few.

DEC 16 - Today, come up with at least one creative idea to resolve a conflict, either in your personal life or your family circle or among friends. Intend to create trust and eliminate hidden hostility and suspicion—the two great enemies of peace.

DEC 17 - Make time to meditate for peace—even five minutes. It will strengthen your sense of calmness and inner peace, and you can carry this feeling with you throughout the busy activities of the day.

DEC 18 - Before you leave the house today, play an uplifting tune you enjoy and have a quick dance. It will wake up your body and align you with your joyful, lighthearted inner spirit.

DEC 19 - If your life is overfilled, today may be a good day to start setting some limits. Stop doing the least important things, the things that honestly don't matter. Set limits on how many times you check inboxes, Instagram, Twitter etc. per day. Use that time to find peace through prayer and presence to the most important things.

DEC 20 - Today, pray this prayer for inner peace, allowing God to take the wheel. "Lord, put your peace in my heart, I'm worried and anxious. My mind races and obsesses. I can't help thinking about my problems. Calm me Lord. Slow me down, put your peace in my heart. No matter what problem I have, Lord, you are bigger and more powerful than it is. I place myself in your hands. Amen."

DEC 21 - Resist the urge to spend your morning buried in your phone screen. Look up at the world around you and protect your sense of inner peace from unraveling due to feelings of comparison and the fear of missing out.

DEC 22 - What you feed your spirit on a daily basis determines the success of one's spiritual journey. If you are reading and listening to things that are not encouraging your soul, try exchanging those for books or podcasts or music that will bring your soul peace.

DEC 23 - Today, make the purpose for speaking be to create happiness in the listener. Have this intention on your mind: Today every word I utter will be chosen consciously. I will refrain from complaints, condemnation, and criticism.

DEC 24 - Choose to see the wonders in the world this day. Wonder brings peace to your life because you are always prepared to see what is good in others. Take a photo today of something you see that causes wonder!

A Brief History



1950 • **St. Edward Chapel (now known as San Felipe de Jesus Chapel)**

St. Edward Chapel in Capistrano Beach was dedicated in 1950. Originally designated as a chapel of Our Lady of Fatima Parish in San Clemente, it received the canonical status of a parish in 1969.

1969 • **Fr. Louis Knight and the beginning of St. Edward Church in Dana Point**

In 1969, Fr. Louis Knight was sent to Dana Point to establish a new parish. On Christmas Eve in 1971, Fr. Louis Knight celebrated the first Mass in the newly constructed church named St. Edward the Confessor Church (now known as Knight Hall).

1980 • **Parish School**

The parish school was built in 1980 to serve the educational needs of its 1,400 registered families.

1994 • **New Church**

The ground-breaking ceremony for the new church took place on April 5, 1992 to serve the growing community of now 2,500 registered families. The church was dedicated by Bishop Norman McFarland on Dec. 11, 1994. Unfortunately, Fr. Louis Knight's death in November 1994 prevented him from ever seeing the completion of the new church. Sadly, but fittingly, the first mass celebrated in the new church was his funeral mass.

1999 • **Master Plan**

In 1999, the parish implemented a master plan and embarked on a capital campaign to accomplish three goals: (1) to renovate and expand the school; (2) to acquire 2.5 acres of adjacent property; (3) and to construct a pastoral center. The initial campaign goal was to raise \$8 million for these three projects. The total amount contributed to the capital campaign was \$6,551,383. The campaign achieved two very significant goals of the master plan. The size of the school was doubled and, with the purchase of additional land, the school field was developed. The church parking lot also doubled in size. The total spent on the project was \$6,680,646. Remaining funds from the 1999 campaign currently total \$736,921. The fact that the campaign account balance is positive even though the project expenses exceeded donations is attributable to deficit funding from St. Edward's general savings during construction.

2007 • **Second Campaign Effort and Priest Rectory**

Under the leadership of Fr. Steve Sallot, a parish committee was formed, an architect was hired and the planning for a pastoral center recommenced. However, in 2008, after a year of planning, the economy suffered the worst financial crisis since the Great Depression. As a result, the campaign was put on hold. During the planning of the pastoral center in 1999 and again in 2007, the idea of moving the rectory (the priest residence) off campus was discussed. Doing so would allow our landlocked parish to use more of our campus for parish ministries. In April 2009, with housing prices at historic lows, the parish purchased a four-plex in Dana Point to be used as a priest residence. The purchase price was \$975,644 and an additional \$622,175 was spent on renovations. The parish used building funds that were allotted for expansion.

2017 • **Now is the Time!**

Through the parish survey that was conducted earlier this year, parishioners expressed their overwhelming support for building a pastoral center and bringing to completion the master plan that began almost 20 years ago. Now is the time to entrust this project to God with daily prayers and sacrifices, and to participate in the campaign with gratitude and generosity for all that God has done for us and our spiritual home of St. Edward the Confessor.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS • VOL. 1

What are the goals of the *Expanding to Love and Serve* Capital Campaign?

Our goal is to build a new pastoral center that will include a parish hall, parish offices and meeting rooms sufficient for the current and future needs of our growing parish community. Additionally, a new gathering space at the entrance of the church will seamlessly integrate the church, pastoral center and our beautiful outdoor space. Altogether, the construction project will give the parish approximately 30,000 square feet of new space to use in loving and serving the Lord and being His disciples.

Where did this idea originate?

This project is the final step in a master plan that is 20 years in the making. The current parish hall is the old church building and was never designed with our current usage in mind. The new pastoral center with a multi-functional parish hall, well-designed parish offices, and additional classrooms and meeting space will more adequately meet our existing parish needs and the needs of generations to come.

Why is this project necessary?

Currently, it is a scramble to find the space necessary to accommodate our parish ministries. Groups such as ENDOW, Binky Patrol, Prayer Shawl Ministry and Mary's Widowed have all hit capacity for the small and limited number of meeting rooms we have available. Our lack of space has stunted or challenged the growth of these and other ministries. Our youth and faith formation programs rely on a hodgepodge of meeting spaces that detract from their sense of belonging on our campus – one of the chief values we hope to convey to our youth. Over 1,000 parishioners are involved in parish ministries outside of Mass and we essentially have four small rooms and an overused parish hall to accommodate them.

What will this project accomplish?

Ultimately, this project is about perpetuating our faith. A new pastoral center and gathering space will be a crucial means for realizing our vision as a House of Prayer and House of the Poor. We need a place to call home for the parish and its ministries. This project will provide us that space and allow for new opportunities in evangelizing and serving. To truly be a church after Christ's own heart, we need a central area to organize and galvanize our efforts.

Can I volunteer in support of the effort?
