Sacrament of the Sick

In the event of serious illness or medical emergency, contact the Parish office to arrange for Anointing of the Sick and Eucharist. In case of a medical emergency after office hours, call (949) 257-8017.

Sacrament of Baptism

Infant Baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month following catechesis for parents and godparents. Parents of infants should contact the Faith Formation office (949) 496-6011 to enroll.

Celebration of Christian Funerals

At the time of death, a family member should contact the Parish office to arrange the date and time for the funeral liturgy.

Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Adults requesting information about full initiation and communion with the Roman Catholic Church (the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) may contact the Faith Formation office at (949) 496-6011.

Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament presumes active sacramental participation on the part of one or both persons. Couples must begin preparation for their Sacrament at least six months prior to their proposed wedding date. Please call the Parish office for more information.

Renovation Q&A

Q: Are there any plans to renovate San Felipe de Jesus Chapel?

A: San Felipe de Jesus Chapel is being constantly maintained in a spirit of good stewardship and has received some much-needed upgrades in recent years. This summer, we plan to paint the exterior of the chapel, the hall, and offices, replace the old worn-out sign and improve the landscaping.

Q: Who was involved in the decision-making of the renovations?

Steve Sallot •Bishop Kevin Vann •Diocesan Design and Renovation Committee •Diocesan Construction Board •Liturgy Design Consultant Robert Habiger of Dekker/Perich/Sabatin who produced a 50-page Liturgical Program, a document consisting of renovation recommendations and considerations • Fr. Q: Is any of the money that was raised in the Parish Capital Campaign in the year 2000 being used to renovate the church?

A: No. (For more information, please see the November 16th bulletin which addressed this question in more detail. Past bulletins are available on the parish website, or you may contact the parish office with any questions).

Q: Is the church going to have carpet or tile?

A: The renovated church will have carpet where there was carpet and tile where there was tile with two exceptions. The sanctuary and Mary's Chapel will be tiled.

Q: How's the renovation going this week?

A: As of Monday, January 19th, we are still on schedule to celebrate our first Mass in the church with Bishop Vann on Friday March 6th. However, there will still be some work to do after March 6th. For example, as anticipated, the tabernacle and processional cross will be finished in June (and well worth the wait).

Interesting Fact: The space where the faithful gather is called a *nave*. The *nave* is important because Christ is present in the baptized who are gathered in his name. However, the Christian family is a *domestic* churches and they too have a *nave*, that is, a place to gather. Our parish family gathers in church to pray and sing. Where in your home does your family pray together? Our parish family has a variety of devotions such as the rosary, the Stations of the Cross, and the Divine Mercy Chaplet. What devotions do you practice in your domestic church?

Communion and Recommendations for Flu Season

With the arrival of cold and flu season, concerns naturally are raised about health and well-being. Common sense and basic hygiene are the best way to limit the spread of flu and cold. During the next couple of months at the recommendation of the Bishop only the hosts will be distributed for communion. Christ is truly and completely present under each of the sacramental signs of either bread or wine. The following guidelines are also recommended.

In Christian charity, please stay home when sick. It is not a sin to miss Mass because you are sick or taking care of someone who is sick. Stay home and return to Church when you are well.

During the Sign of Peace, if you are feeling ill, have flu-like symptoms, or simply do not want to shake hands, you can make a simpler gesture such as a smile or a bow of the head with the words "Peace be with you" to show the mutual charity celebrated in this part of the liturgy.

Fr. Junipero Serra (1713-1784)

On January 15, Pope Francis unexpectedly announced that he will canonize Fr. Junípero Serra (1713 – 1784), founder of nine California missions, when he visits the United States in September for the upcoming World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia. The canonization will take place at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the *Immaculate Conception* in Washington, D.C.

Many of us have fond memories of visiting Mission San Juan Capistrano when we were children and later trying to construct a model of a Mission (with a lot of help from mom and dad). Soon, visitors of all walks of life will come to know Fr. Serra as much more than a founder of nine California Missions. Instead, the canonization of Fr. Serra provides the opportunity to rediscover Serra as a man of great Christian faith with tireless missionary zeal.

In his message for the 87th World Mission Day Oct. 20, 2013, Pope Francis challenged us to be missionaries in our daily lives, saying: "the strength of our faith, at a personal and community level, can be measured by the ability to communicate it to others, to spread and live it in charity, to witness to it before those we meet and those who share the path of life with us."

After recognizing and receiving our Lord in the Eucharist today, may we show the strength of our faith by communicating it to others in charity.

Myth: Immigrants are a drain on the U.S. economy.

Fact: The immigrant community in the U.S. is, in fact, a net benefit to the economy. A recent government report estimates that, "in aggregate and over the long term, tax revenues of all types generated by immigrants—both legal and unauthorized—exceed the cost of the services they use." Other research reveals the average immigrant pays a net \$80,000 more in taxes than they collect in government services.
