### Advent

On November 27th we begin a new liturgical year in the Church. (This makes it a good day for a "New Year's resolution.") The season of Advent is our time to prepare spiritually for the great feast of Christmas. We often speak of the "spirit of Christmas," and it is good that we identify the true spirit of the feast. But we cannot really enjoy the spirit of Christmas if we do not first have the spirit of Advent. It is a time of preparation for Christ, longing for Christ, and

identifying the parts of our own lives that are most in need of a greater presence of Christ. In a sense Advent represents life itself, since our entire earthly life is a preparation for eternal life with Christ.

There are numerous ways to make this a season of true preparation for the Lord. You might want to have an Advent wreath in your home, and light the appropriate candle(s) each evening during dinner. (I hope you eat dinner together as a family.) You might consider participating in weekday Mass on one or more days during the week. Contributions to charitable causes are particularly appropriate during this time, when the needs of the poor are most strongly felt. Reflecting on the Scriptures, especially the readings of the Mass each day, is also a great way to pray with God's Word.

Let's enter into the spirit of Advent as fully as possible, so the spirit of Christmas may find its home in us.

### Adviento

El 27 de noviembre iniciamos un nuevo año litúrgico en la Iglesia. (Es un buen día para hacer una "resolución de Año Nuevo"). La temporada de Adviento es una oportunidad para prepararnos espiritualmente para la gran celebración de Navidad. A menudo hablamos del "espíritu de la Navidad", y es bueno que identifiquemos el verdadero espíritu de la fiesta. Pero no podemos disfrutar realmente del espíritu de la Navidad sin primero tener el espíritu del Adviento. Es un tiempo de preparación para la llegada de Cristo, anhelo de Cristo e identificación de las partes de nuestra propia vida que más necesitan una mayor presencia de Cristo. En efecto, el Adviento representa la vida misma, ya que toda nuestra vida en la tierra es una preparación para la vida eterna con Cristo.

Hay varias maneras de hacer de ésta una temporada de verdadera preparación para recibir al Señor. Es posible que desee tener una corona de Adviento en su hogar y encender las velas apropiadas cada noche durante la cena. (Espero que cenen juntos como familia). Tambien podría considerar participar en la Misa entre semana uno o más días durante la semana. Las contribuciones a causas benéficas son particularmente apropiadas durante este tiempo, cuando las necesidades de los pobres se sienten con más fuerza. Reflexionar sobre las Escrituras, especialmente las lecturas de la Misa de cada día, también es una excelente manera de orar con la Palabra de Dios.

Entremos pues, lo más plenamente posible en el espíritu de Adviento, para que el espíritu de la Navidad encuentre su hogar en nosotros.



## The Advent Season - Week 1

### REV. JOSEPH SQUILLACIOTI, S.T.L.



Advent is the first season of the Church year in which we prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Not only is it a memory of the first Christmas, but it is also a preparation for the Second coming of Christ at the end of time. There is a unique way in which the Church celebrates this season through conversion towards Christ. Rather than having solely a strong focus on the Second Advent – the Second Coming of Christ - there is also a focus on the fulfillment of the prophecy from old.

Using the prophecies from the prophet Isaiah, there are seven titles which were used for prayer and preparation beginning in probably the early 500's. These "O Antiphons" were recited before and after a hymn to the Virgin Mary and were a natural means to reflect on the historical coming of the Messiah as understood by the Israelites. They are also found in the seven verses of the song "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

These seven names (in Latin) are:

- O Sapientia (O come thou Wisdom)
- O Adonai (O come thou Lord)
- O Radix Jesse (O come thou Root of Jesse)
- O Clavis David (O come thou Key of David)
- O Oriens (O come thou Star of the East)
- O Rex Gentium (O come thou King)
- O Emmanuel (O come God Nations Desire)

The underlined letters above form the Latin phrase Ero Cras. As the Church calls out "O Come,

Emmanuel," Christ responds with the phrase "Ero Cras" – I will be there tomorrow!

This great call and answer is one of hope, especially as John the Baptist calls us to repentance – to make straight our ways because the Lord is near.

The next few weeks I will be reflecting on each of these titles of the Messiah. As we sing the Entrance Hymn, these weeks, think about the different names and how we can better understand that aspect of the Messiah.

O come thou Wisdom from on high...

This verse specifically refers to the Word (Christ Jesus) as the very Wisdom – the Sapientia - of God the Father.

O Wisdom, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation. Isaiah had prophesied, The spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him: a spirit of wisdom and of understanding, a spirit of counsel and of strength, a spirit of knowledge and fear of the Lord, and his delight shall be the fear of the Lord. (Isaiah 11:2-3), and Wonderful is His counsel and great is His wisdom. (Isaiah 28:29).

O come, O come thou Lord of Might...
This verse considers Christ as Adonai – the God of the Covenant and ruler of the house of Israel.
O sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain: come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free.


Isaiah had prophesied, But He shall judge the poor with justice, and decide aright for the lands afflicted. He shall strike the ruthless with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall slay the wicked. Justice shall be the band around his waist, and faithfulness a belt upon his hips. (Isaiah 11:4-5); and Indeed the Lord will be there with us, majestic; yes the Lord our judge, the Lord our lawgiver, the Lord our king, he it is who will save us. (Isaiah 33:22).


### How You Can Help
