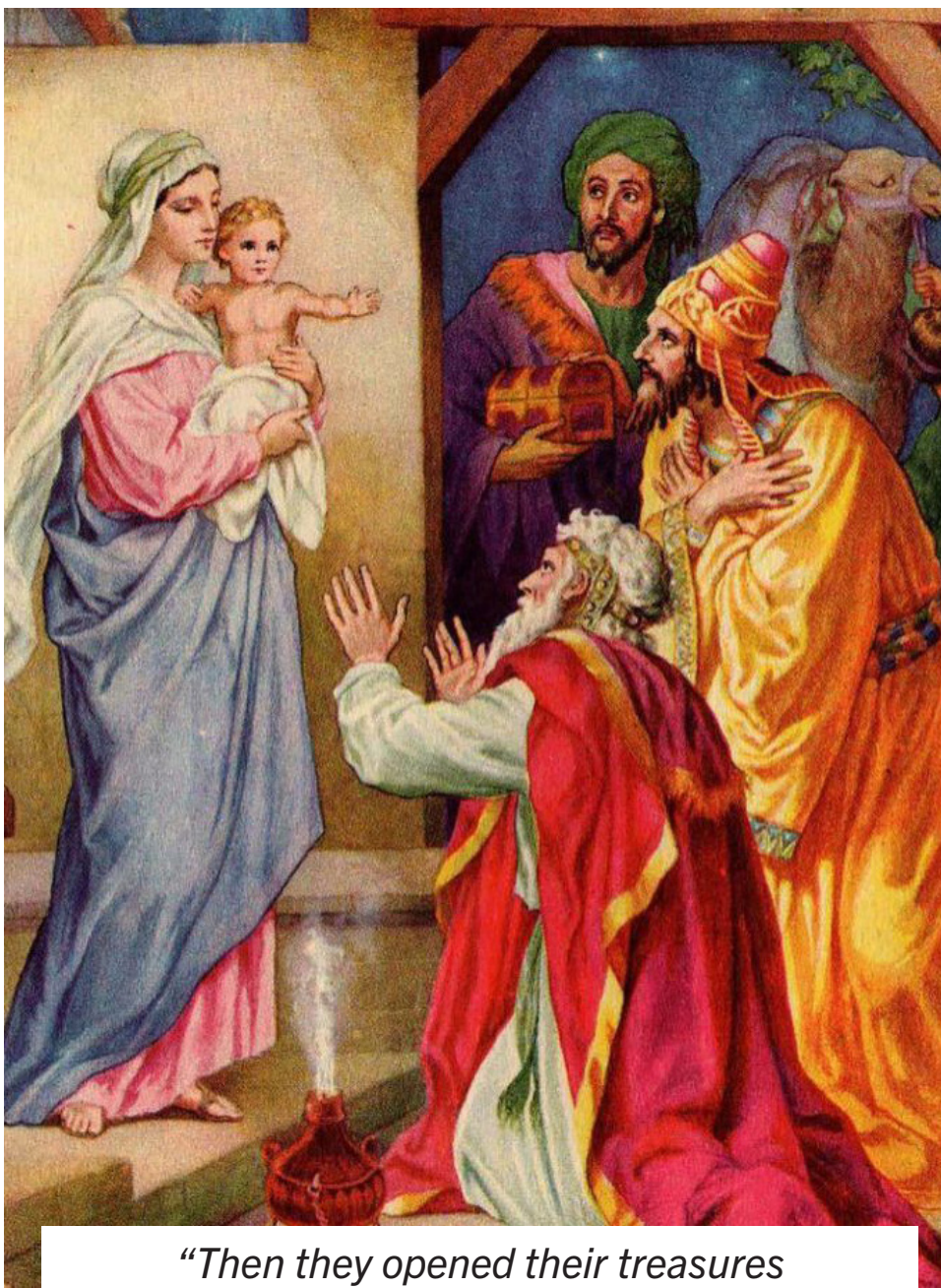

The Epiphany of the Lord

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Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord is the last big celebration of the Church's Christmas season. The word "epiphany" means "manifestation" in Greek. This is the day when we commemorate the Lord being manifest to the magi from the East as a newborn King. Led by a star, they found him with his mother and foster father and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gold acknowledges Christ as a King. Frankincense professes that he is God. Myrrh recognizes him as man, a human being like us.

For us, the gold we can offer Christ is our allegiance to him. His teachings are not always popular or convenient for us; following them in all circumstances shows that we are loyal members of his Kingdom. In the Lord's Prayer we pray "Thy Kingdom come." These words might be a good short prayer to say anytime we are faced with a decision that involves the teachings of Christ.

Frankincense has been a sign of the Transcendent for many ages. The incense we offer is our faith. Of course, this means not only acceptance of a list of truths, but also a way of life. Prayer is paramount in our profession of faith. Living the sacramental life goes right along with prayer. We worship the Lord and we enter into communion with him as the Source of all that we have and all that we are.

Myrrh was a fragrant balm used to anoint bodies for burial. It is an acknowledgment of the humanity of Christ. As the Letter to the Hebrews (4:15) tells us, he was like us in all things but sin. Our myrrh is our acceptance of the joys and sorrows, the possibilities and limitations, of our humanity in union with the Lord. He knows what it is like to be us, because he is one of us. Remembering that he is our Brother sheds wonderful light on the dignity of each human person.

Wise persons still seek him. Today we join the magi in following the star to our Newborn King.

Oro, incienso y mirra

La Solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor es la última gran celebración del tiempo litúrgico de Navidad la Iglesia. La palabra "epifanía" significa "manifestación" en griego. Este es el día en que conmemoramos que el Señor se manifestó a los magos de Oriente como un Rey recién nacido. Guiados por una estrella, lo encontraron con su madre y su padre adoptivo y le ofrecieron regalos de oro, incienso y mirra. El oro reconoce a Cristo como Rey. El incienso profesa que él es Dios. Mirra lo reconoce como un hombre, un ser humano como nosotros.

Para nosotros, el oro que podemos ofrecerle a Cristo es nuestra lealtad a él. Sus enseñanzas no siempre son populares o convenientes para nosotros; seguirlos en todas las circunstancias demuestra que somos miembros leales de su Reino. En el Padrenuestro oramos: "Venga tu Reino". Estas palabras pueden ser una buena oración corta para decir cada vez que nos enfrentemos a una decisión que involucre las enseñanzas de Cristo.

El incienso ha sido un signo de lo Trascendente durante muchas edades. El incienso que ofrecemos es nuestra fe. Por supuesto, esto significa no solo la aceptación de una lista de verdades, sino también una forma de vida. La oración es primordial en nuestra profesión de fe. Vivir la vida sacramental va junto con la oración. Adoramos al Señor y entramos en comunión con él como la Fuente de todo lo que tenemos y somos.

La mirra era un bálsamo fragante que se usaba para ungir los cuerpos para el entierro. Es un reconocimiento de la humanidad de Cristo. Como nos dice la Carta a los Hebreos (4:15), él era como nosotros en todo menos en el pecado. Nuestra mirra es nuestra aceptación de las alegrías y las tristezas, las posibilidades y limitaciones de nuestra humanidad en unión con el Señor. Reconoce lo que es ser como nosotros, porque es uno de nosotros. Recordar que es nuestro Hermano arroja una luz maravillosa sobre la dignidad de cada persona humana.

Los sabios todavía lo buscan. Hoy nos unimos a los magos en seguir la estrella hasta nuestro Rey Recién Nacido.

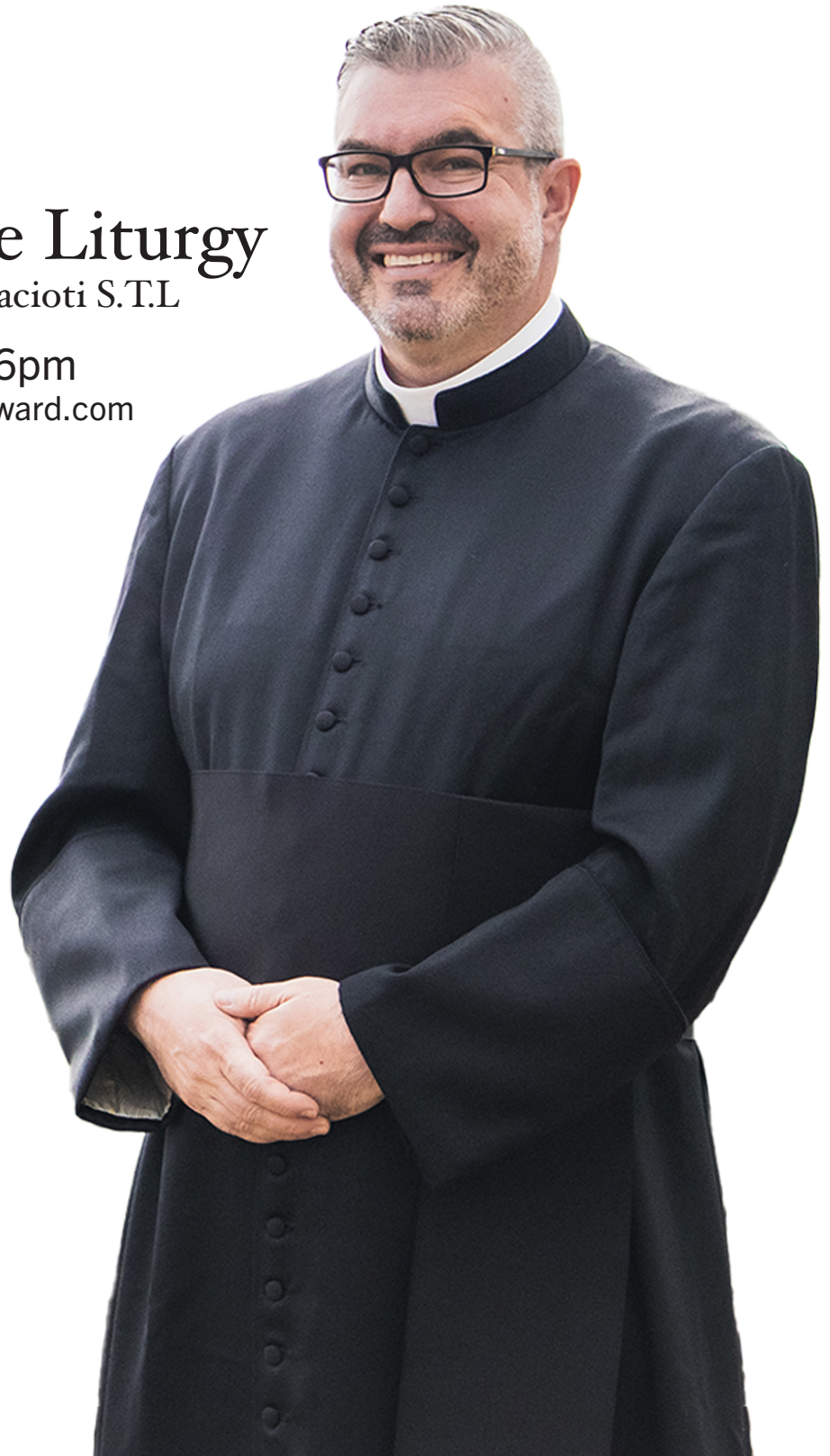
