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Taking the Passion Personally

During the liturgies of Palm Sunday and Good Friday, the assembly has the unique experience of helping to proclaim the Gospel. Perhaps it feels strange to repeat the words of the crowd, calling for the crucifixion of Christ. Certainly, we do not want Jesus to suffer.

Our participation in this Gospel is an invitation to take the Passion of Jesus Christ personally. One way we do this is to examine ourselves in the light of the Gospel and discern which figures in the Gospel narrative we might resemble. Are we like Peter, who spoke

enthusiastically about being faithful to Christ but then deserted him when things became difficult? Are we like Judas, who traded his faithfulness to Christ for material gain? Are we like Pilate, who tried to wash his hands of responsibility for his actions? Are we like the crowd, easily swayed from praising Christ to condemning him? Are we like Simon of Cyrene, who carried the cross only under protest, because he had to?

The list of characters could go on. Hopefully we are like the Apostle John and the Virgin Mary, who remained with Jesus until the end. Hopefully we imitate Jesus himself, as he forgave his executioners from the cross. Taking the Passion personally means that we recognize our call to imitate the Lord and those who are closest to him.

Taking the Passion personally also means that we remember that Jesus suffered and died for each of us. His redemptive love for us is so great that he gave his life, and then took it up again, for each of us personally. How blessed we are to be loved so much! Gratefully we accompany the Lord throughout this Holy Week.

Tomando la Pasión de Jesucristo Personalmente

Durante las liturgias del Domingo de Ramos y del Viernes Santo, la asamblea tiene la oportunidad de ayudar a proclamar el Evangelio. Quizás esto se sienta extraño al repetir las palabras de la multitud, pidiendo la crucifixión de Cristo. Ciertamente no queremos que Jesús sufra.

Nuestra participación en este Evangelio es una invitación para tomar personalmente la Pasión de Cristo. Una forma de hacer esto es examinarnos a la luz del Evangelio y discernir a qué personajes de la narración del Evangelio nos parecemos más. ¿Somos como Pedro, que habló con entusiasmo acerca de ser fiel a Cristo, pero luego lo abandonó cuando las cosas se pusieron difíciles? ¿Somos como Judas, que cambió su fidelidad a Cristo por lo material? ¿Somos como Pilato, que trató de lavarse las manos para librarse de responsabilidad por sus acciones? ¿Somos como la multitud, que fácilmente se desvía de alabar a Cristo para después condenarlo? ¿Somos como Simón de Cirene, que llevó la cruz solo porque tenía que hacerlo?

La lista de personajes podría continuar. Ojalá seamos como el Apóstol Juan y la Virgen María, que permanecieron con Jesús hasta el final. Ojalá imitemos al mismo Jesús, como perdonó a sus verdugos desde la cruz. Tomar la Pasión de Cristo personalmente significa que reconocemos nuestra llamada a imitar al Señor y a los que están más cerca de él.

Tomar la Pasión de Cristo personalmente significa también que recordamos que Jesús sufrió y murió por cada uno de nosotros. Su amor redentor por nosotros es tan grande que dio su vida, y luego la retomó, por cada uno de nosotros. ¡Cuán bendecidos somos de ser amados tanto! Agradecidos acompañamos al Señor a lo largo de esta Semana Santa.

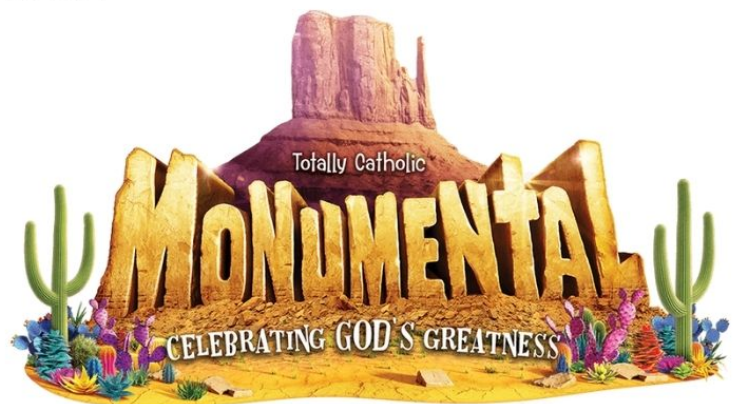

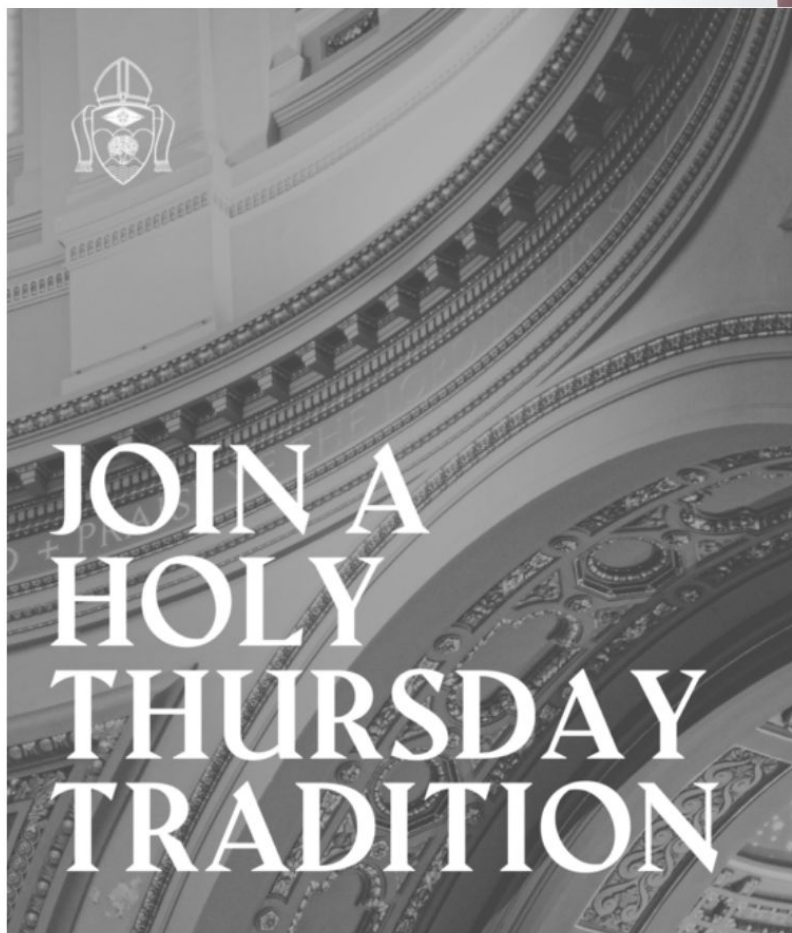
